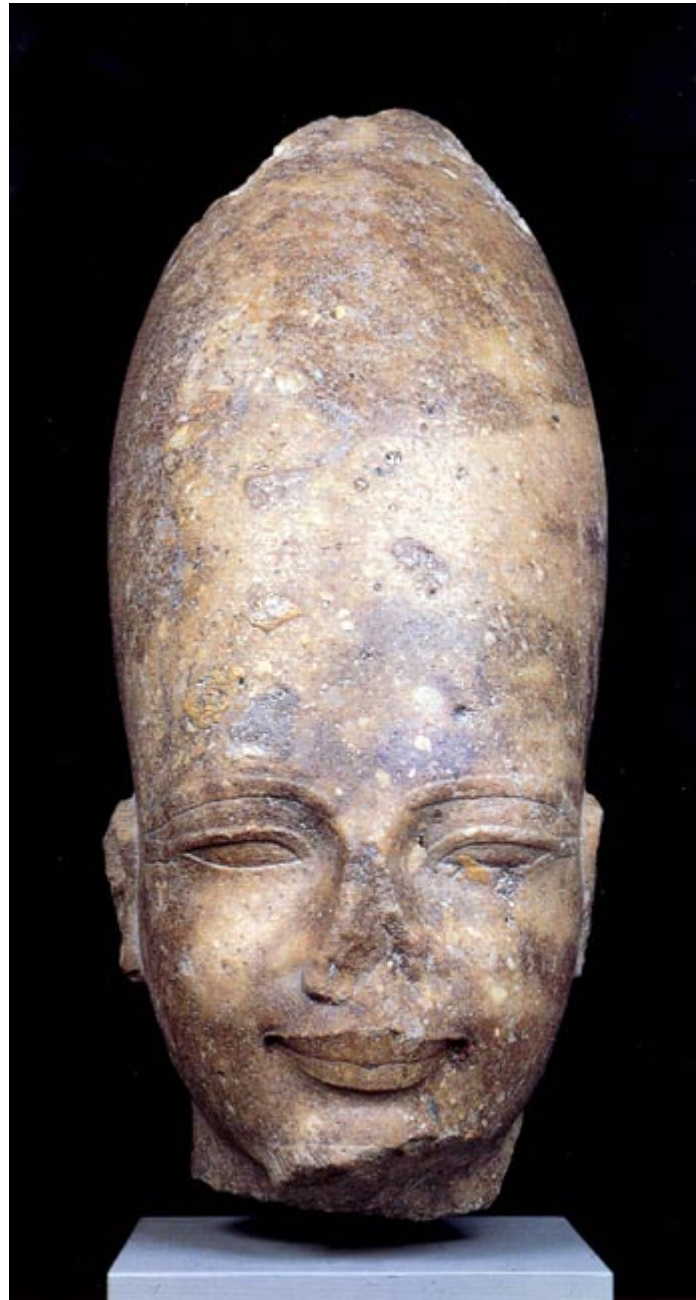

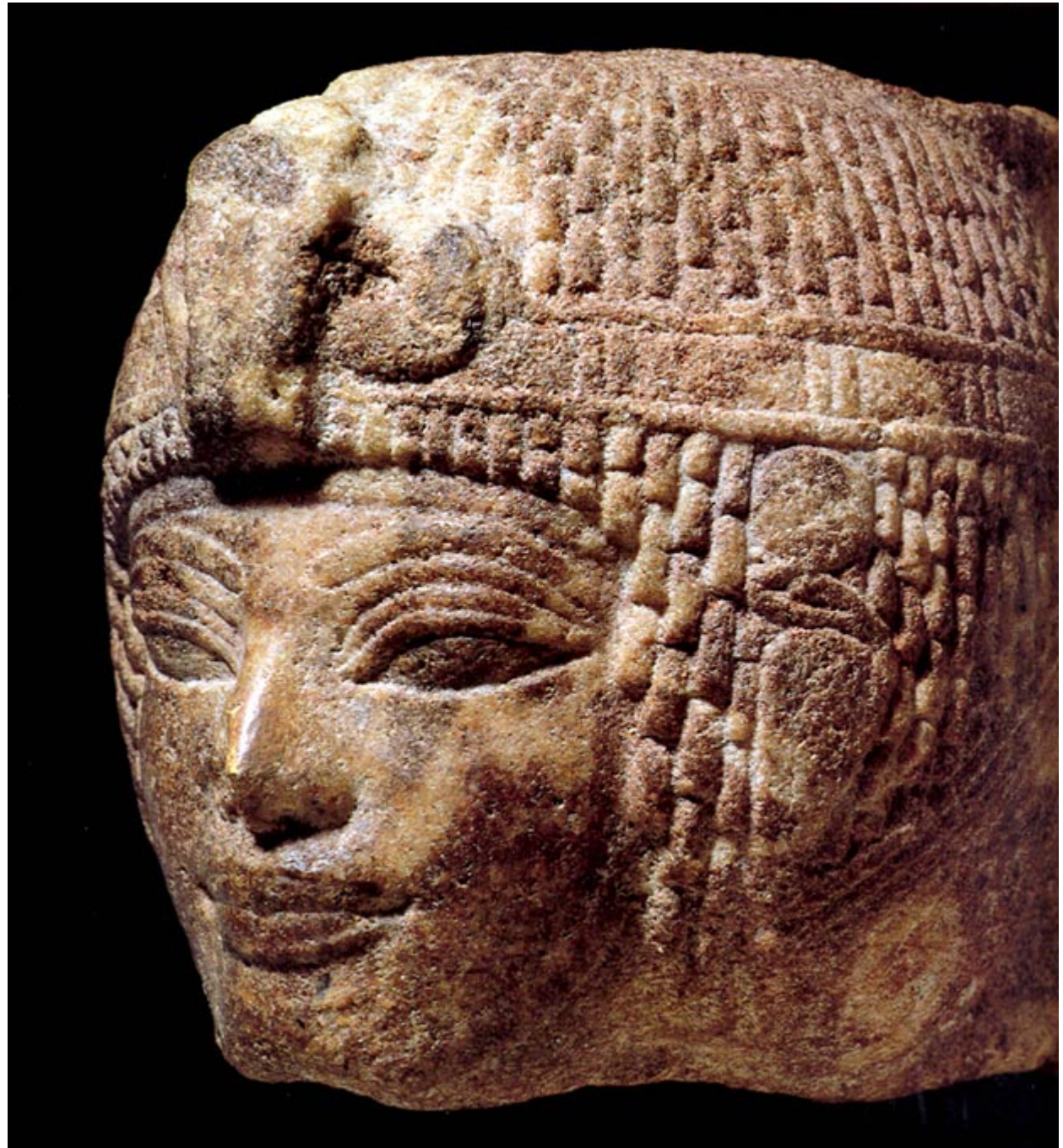

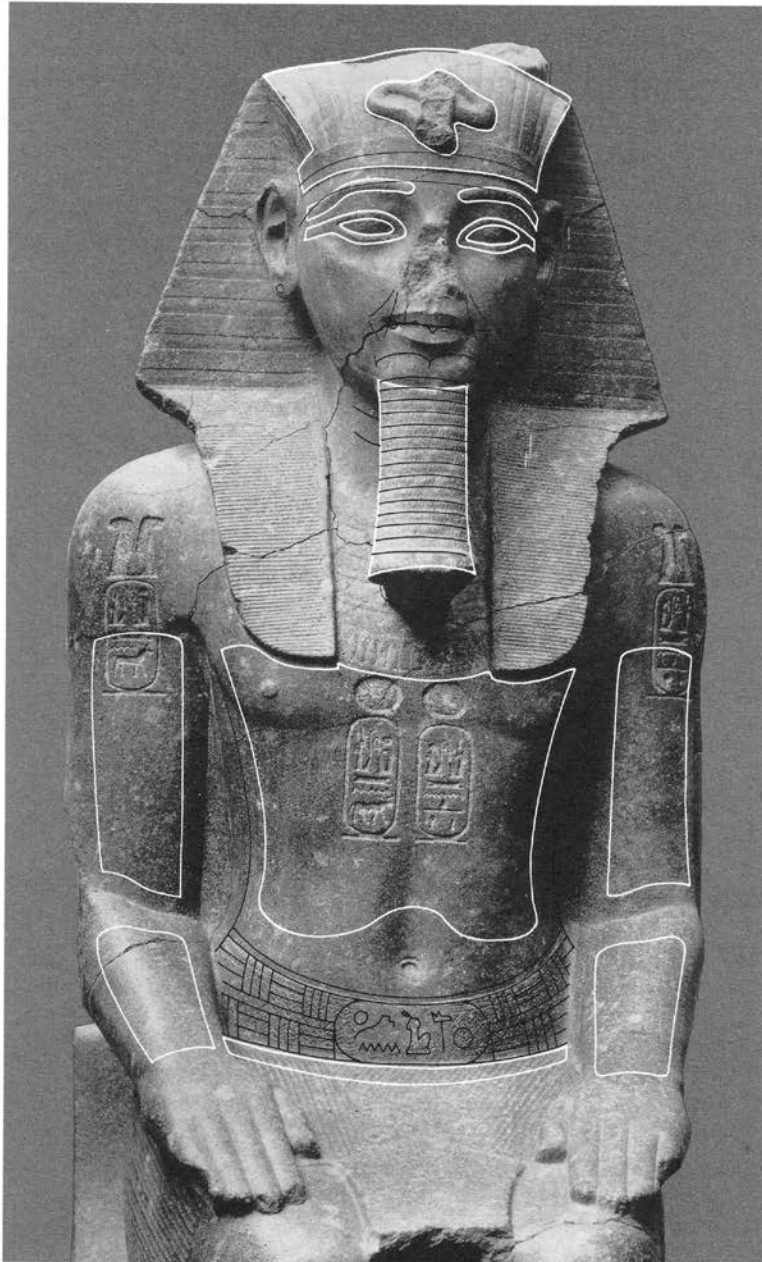
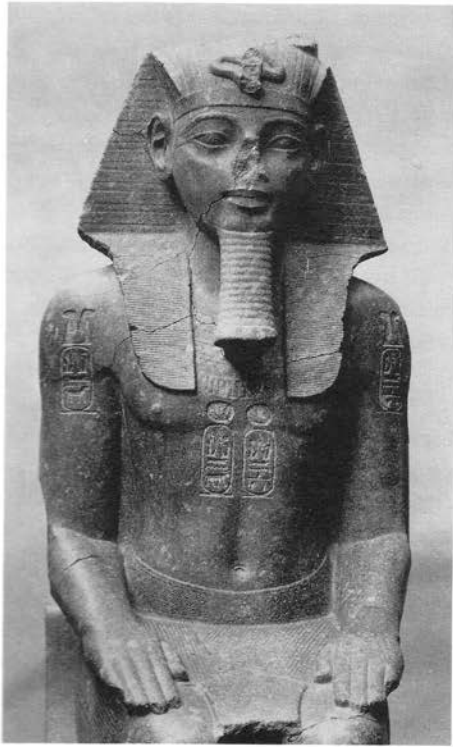

Right: An illustration of where this sculpture would have been reworked had it been usurped by Ramesses II. Black lines indicate chisel, drill, and other tool marks. White lines enclose abraded areas. Ramesses II's artisans used such techniques to usurp countless images of Amenhotep III, but his successor Merenptah accomplished the same ends by simply having his cartouches carved on the statues.

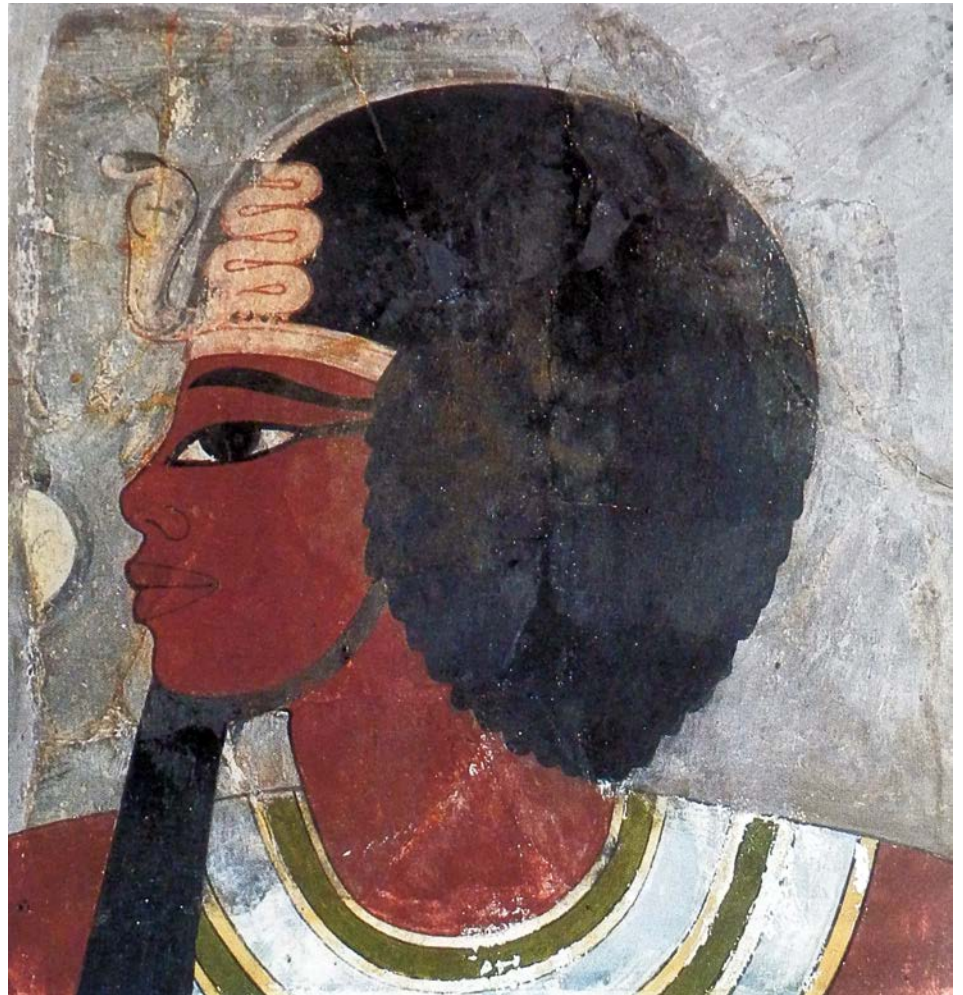

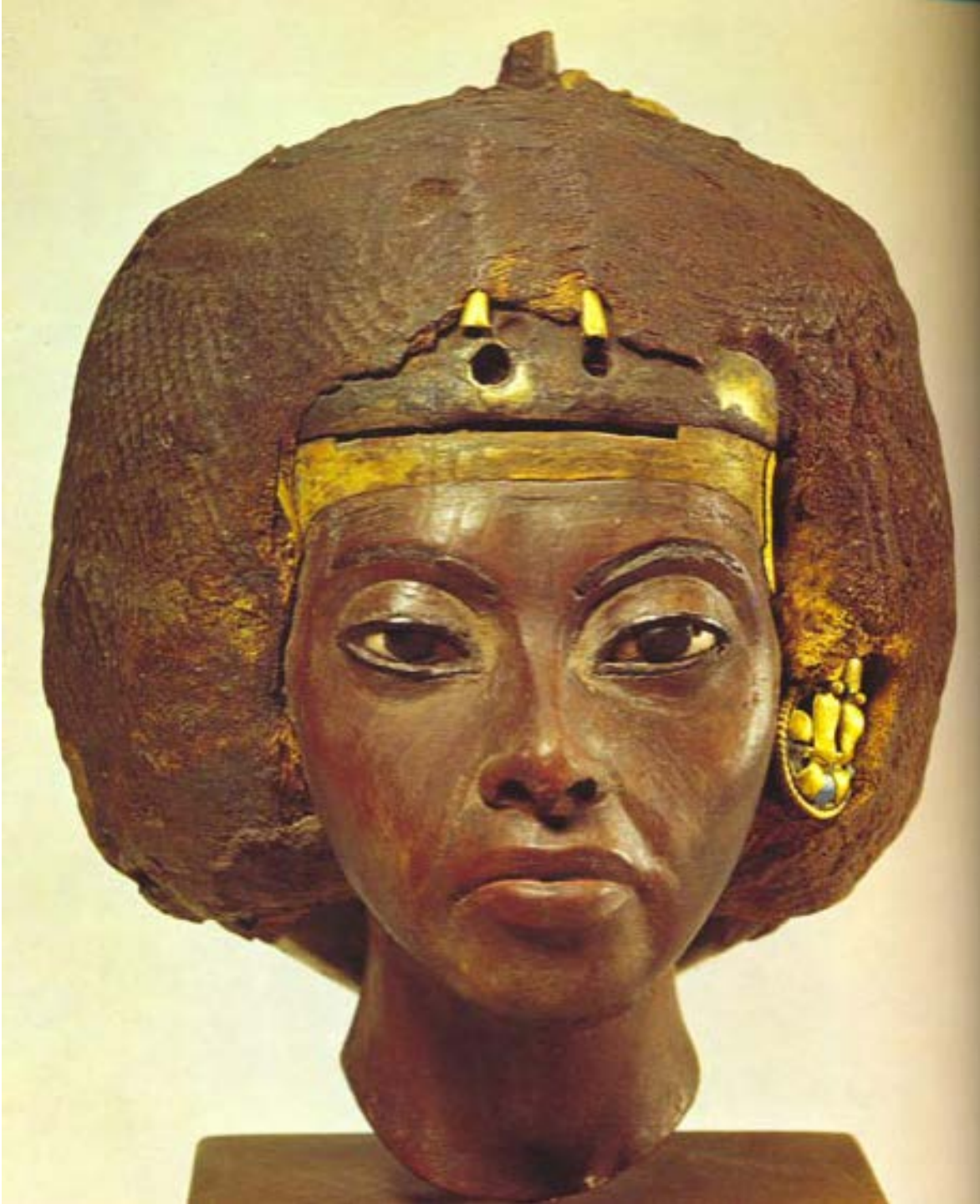
