taking place **October 21–22, 2021** either at the Deutsche Bundesbank Conference Center in Eltville am Rhein or entirely online, contingent on the prevailing status of the Corona-virus pandemic. Topics of particular interest include, but are not limited to: competition and risk-taking of individual banks, the (e)valuation of climate risks by financial institutions and in financial markets, the stability of the financial sector and its regulation, the role of real estate markets for financial system resilience.

The workshop aims at linking young economists interested in related topics. It provides a platform to exchange ideas and discuss recent contributions. Presentations, assigned comments and general discussions create an inspiring setting.
